Autumn Greetings from Osaka, Japan!



After a prolonged hot summer season that extended late into September, a new phenomenon in Japan called *akibate* has emerged. Literally meaning "Autumn fatigue," *akibate* refers to the disruption of the body's autonomic nervous system caused by changes

in the weather. Even though the weather has cooled off considerably in the last month, people are still experiencing a physical tiredness caused by the longer-than-usual summer heat. Welcome to Autumn fatigue.



Despite this new phenomenon, Autumn is a busy season in Japan. Annual activities include:

* Harvest moon viewing in September

- * Undo-kai (Sports Day) in the schools
- * Culture Day in October
- * Shichi-Go-San (Seven-Five-Three), a ceremony in November where people bring their children (aged 7, 5 & 3) to be dedicated at the local shrine.
